REMINDERS APPLICABLE TO ALL CLASSES

- Unless you are using the 2016-2017 curriculum sheet ^{*}, Special Studies (4000, 4010, 4020, 4030, 4980, and 4990) courses do not fulfill any graduation requirements in the HD major. (A maximum of 12 credits of Special Studies can be counted as electives.)

FOR SENIORS AND JUNIORS

- 4000-level classes fill up very quickly; procrastination is not your friend.
- Unless you are following the 2016-2017 curriculum, you must declare an Area of Concentration if you haven't already done so. This is not done automatically; you must inform Lori Asperschlager at law32@cornell.edu.
- Make sure that all the distribution requirements for your major and the college are in the process of being fulfilled. As you've probably realized by now, it's not wise to assume that a specific course you want to take will be offered during your last semester or last year. Professors go on leave and their course may not be taught.

FOR EVERYONE

- Many of you might find it advantageous to switch to the ^{*} [new major \(2016-2017\)](#) because
 - You are not required to fulfill a concentration (nor do you have to declare one)
 - You still need 6 credits at 4000 level, but up to 3 of those credits can be HD4010 Empirical Research and 3 credits of HD4990 Honors Research can also count toward the major. **(All of these credits must be graded; no S/Us allowed; please see the [new curriculum sheet](#) for more details.)**
 - The distribution/breadth requirement is simpler and easier.
 - You don't need to talk to an advisor to make the switch, or file a petition. You can **make the switch by emailing Lori Asperschlager** at law32@cornell.edu .
- Statistics courses available for Fall 2017 that fulfill the HD requirement are: AEM 2100, BTRY 3010, ILRST2100, MATH 1710, PSYCH 3500(4 credit option only)
