- Archive and replication services to fulfill funder and journal requirements for data management plans.

The **Cornell Federal Statistical Research Data Center** [<https://nyrdc.cornell.edu/>] is a member of the national network of 28 FSRDCs managed by the US Census Bureau. Cornell University and Baruch College are the lab sites for the New York RDC consortium of research institutions. Researchers with approved projects are able to access and analyze confidential data from federal statistical agencies including the Census Bureau, National Center for Health Statistics, the Bureau of Labor Statistics, and more.

The **Labor Dynamics Institute** within the ILR School at Cornell has the mission to create and make accessible novel data on the dynamics of the labor markets. We work with research networks and statistical agencies, developing appropriate statistics to inform policy makers, researchers, and simply people seeking knowledge. We emphasize and meet the requirements of stakeholders: users as well as providers, balancing the utility of the data with the confidentiality of the people and businesses whose activities the data describe.
