

Focus of Parenting Education during COVID-19

Common concerns shared in conversations by parents and caregivers as a result of COVID-19

1. Fear of getting infected with the virus.
2. Losing sources of income.
3. Not having access to medical attention if needed.
4. Not being able to pay their rent.
5. High levels of anxiety about having their child/children at home all day.
6. Discomfort about helping children do school work remotely.
7. Not knowing what to say or how to explain to the children the sudden change in their lives.
8. Losing patience with their children.
9. Aggressive behaviors to and from spouses.
10. Profound sense of uncertainty for the future.

The **Growing and Learning Together through Play (GLTP) Curriculum** is a research-informed curriculum/workshop series designed for adults who are parents or primary caregiver to preschool-aged children, 2-5 years of age. The curriculum includes eight workshops containing educational material about early childhood development and activities to promote language development and special skills through play!



WORKSHOP 1: The Role of Play in Early Learning, What It Is and Why It Is Important

Stages of Early Childhood Development: Characteristics of developing cognitive, social, emotional, and physical activities through play.

WORKSHOP 2: Getting to Know your Child's Interest in Play

Knowing children's individual differences and identifying their unique interest in directed, guided, and free play.

WORKSHOP 3: The Role of Discipline in Learning through Play

Identifying the role of discipline in learning.

WORKSHOP 4: Play Time with Children When Time Is Limited

Learning strategies to engage in children's play when time is limited.

WORKSHOP 5: Play: A Vehicle to Promote Language Development, Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving Question Asking and pretend, narrative, and explanatory talk.
