EXTENSION AND OUTREACH

My appointment at Cornell was a 70% Extension/30% Research split. The overall aim of my extension work has been to develop and evaluate research-based community educational and environmental models that promote health in collaboration with community leaders, health professionals, and extension educators working with Cornell Cooperative Extension. I was the Division Extension Leader from 2002 to 2006.

A summary of selected efforts in Extension and Outreach follows. Other Extension contributions are listed under Presentations (e.g. Presentations for the Public & In-service Education above) and as Extension Publications listed below.

Cornell Program on Breast Cancer and Environmental Risk Factors (BCERF)

I was the Education Leader of the Cornell Program on Breast Cancer and Environmental Risk Factors (BCERF) from 1995-2004. Three example among many BCERF educational initiatives:

Small Steps are Easier Together Development, implementation, and evaluation of a successful community environmental intervention to increase physical activity and healthy eating at small rural worksites. At the end of the 10-week intervention 81% of participants met the project goal (adding 2000 walking steps over baseline on 3 or more days a week) for 3 or more weeks and 46% met the goal for more than 7 weeks. The greatest increase was reported by participants who reported the fewest steps at baseline. On average, 87% of those reporting met the walking goal each week. Compared to baseline levels, intervention participants were significantly more likely post-intervention to report that they walked regularly for exercise, participated in a walking group, brought healthy dishes to community events, chose healthy dishes at community events, encouraged others to bring healthy dishes, and to try healthy dishes at community events. (Warren et al., *Prevent Med.* 2010; 50 (5-6), 230-234.)

Development and Dissemination of BCERF Science-Based Fact Sheets

The BCERF program developed an effective model for translating and disseminating research on breast cancer and life style risk factors. Specifically, 24 online fact sheets in the area of diet, life-style and breast cancer risk were developed, based on critical evaluations of the research literature. In one typical year of this program (2005-06) there were an average of 6052 fact sheet downloads per month, plus 16,571 web views of fact sheets. Three fact sheets covering diet, lifestyle and breast cancer survival, phytoestrogens, and body type were consistently among

the top 3 most viewed fact sheets each month, with 3900 or more monthly requests each. (Breast Cancer & Environmental Risk Factors Archived site 1996-2008)

The BCERF Tool Kit: *Environment and Breast Cancer: Teaching Tools for Change*

To disseminate breast cancer risk reduction in community settings, we developed a set of practical educational tools for community educators who wished to integrate breast cancer risk reduction strategies in their communities. The Tool Kit included five flexible educational modules, tailored for specific community audiences, covering practical breast cancer risk reduction strategies such as eating a healthful diet, being active, and limiting exposure to environmental chemicals. Each module incorporated activities, supporting educational materials, audiovisual masters, and a leader's guide. We disseminated the BCERF Tool Kit through a national satellite videoconference for 548 people at 70 sites in 20 states and the District of Columbia: 548 (97%) of the participants returned evaluations reporting that: 1) 82 % expanded their knowledge of breast cancer risk reduction; 2) 78 % knew how to integrate risk reduction into their work; 3) 93% understood our intergenerational approach to breast cancer risk reduction; and 4) 59% knew how to use the BCERF educational Tool Kit in their work. The BCERF Tool Kit was selected as a national Program of Excellence by USDA for Family Development and Resource Management.

Sisters in Health was a community-based, controlled trial designed to be delivered by Cooperative Extension educators in local counties. *Sisters in Health* was designed as a flexible series of six weekly meetings for groups of approximately 10 women and emphasized practical ways to prepare tasty, quick, and inexpensive fruit and vegetable dishes. Participants learned as they cook and talk together, sharing their skills and experiences. In a quasi-experimental pre- and post-program evaluation, intervention group participants reported eating significantly more fruits and vegetables (1.6 more times/day vs. 0.8 more times/day) than control group participants. (Devine et al., *J Nutr Educ Behav.* 2005; 37:265-270). Following a field test, two thirds of participating New York State county Extension Associations continued to use the program at least six years later, and 11 additional counties began to use *SIH*, which became a core educational resource for food and nutrition extension education in New York State. It was also translated into Spanish, used in several other states, and promoted as an example of Learner Centered Education as part of a panel at the national meeting of the Food and Nutrition Extension Educators in July 2007.

Cornell NutritionWorks (CNW)

I was the original founder and then research collaborator on Cornell Nutrition Works (CNW), after CNW leadership was taken over by Christina Stark. By December 2013, 12 years after its founding, Cornell NutritionWorks membership had increased to almost 17,000 members from 184 countries. In one year, the number of continuing professional education credits (hours) earned by users was over 14,000 from among 98 available Continuing Professional Education credits.

Childhood Obesity Prevention Online Course on CNW: *Preventing Childhood Obesity: An Ecological Approach*

A 6-week interactive online course was designed to increase the capacity of nutrition and extension professionals to prevent childhood obesity in their communities as a result of increased

professional competence and confidence. Based on a health program planning model, the course helped participants assess and prioritize local factors related to childhood obesity, build and facilitate collaborations, and develop an action plan for community intervention. The course was developed through a collaboration between C. Stark (PI), W. Wolfe, J. Dollahite, C. Olson, and myself. Over eight sessions, the course was delivered to a total of 383 nutrition and extension professionals; 376 completed at least one of the three surveys and 240 completed all three surveys. Intentions to apply course principles at course end were significantly and positively associated with actions. Individual networking ability, and three organizational characteristics (ecological approach within job scope, funding, course content applied to work) were positively and significantly associated with the application of an ecological approach at post-course and 6-month follow-up compared to pre-course levels.
