# Community Coordinator, Dietetic Internship Program Cornell University

In consultation with community-based dietetic intern preceptors, developed individualized learning plans for annual classes of 10 interns. Learning plans included a research topic for each intern that was specific and salient to her or his supervised professional practice placement site.

- Graduate Instruction. Community Nutrition in Action (NS 6250) Fall semester 2009-2014. This course was designed to integrate with and enhance Community Nutrition supervised professional practice rotation. The integration of theory and practice was considered at individual, interpersonal, community, and systems levels. Students explored current and emerging roles public and private community nutrition programs play in public health. External influences on program effectiveness and success, such as food marketing, policy, and food system contexts were discussed.

Through placements in community programs, students gained real world experience in assessing, designing, implementing, administrating, and evaluating food and nutrition programs for targeted populations through not-for-profit, pubic, and for-profit private entities.

Developed to: increase understanding of practical implications of integrating food skill development into nutrition education; identify and fill gaps in food skills among dietetic interns; and, identify appropriate food skills nutrition education content for diverse audiences. NS 6250 students worked in teams to lead entire class in preparing a lunch menu over the course of the Fall 2013 Semester. Constraints: Lunches were to feature at two vegetables and one fruit (both in season), provide a whole grain and a complete protein, be void in added trans fats, provide a minimum of between 450 and 500 calories per person, and adhere to MyPyramid recommendations, the Dietary Guidelines and any other class-generated criteria.
